Irish Rare Bird Report 2018

Introduction

There were two species new to Ireland discovered in 2018, both found in October; a first-winter Veery *Catharus fuscescens* (Cork), and a first-winter Taiga Flycatcher *Ficedula albicilla* (Cork).

In addition, Ireland's second Eastern Subalpine Warbler *Sylvia cantillans albistriata* (Donegal) was recorded in May. Ireland's third ever Mourning Dove *Zenaida macroura* (Galway) and Bufflehead *Bucephala albeola* (Cork) were both found in November. The fourth Irish Pacific Diver *Gavia pacifica* (Cork) was present from January to April, returning again from October to December.

Other highlights in 2018 included the sixth Scarlet Tanager *Piranga olivacea* (Cork) for Ireland, the seventh Booted Warbler *Iduna caligata* (Kerry), the eighth Swainson's Thrush *Catharus ustulatus* (Cork), the 12th record of Blackpoll Warbler *Setophaga striata* (Galway) and the 14th and 15th records of Blyth's Reed Warblers *Acrocephalus dumetorum* (Cork and Donegal).

The backbone of the IRBC's system for recording occurrences of rare birds in the Republic of Ireland is the Provisional List, published online at www.irbc.ie/provisional/provisional.php, which is updated regularly. Most of the data in this report were taken directly from the 2018 Provisional List. The IRBC expresses its sincere

2018 Systematic List

The sequence and scientific nomenclature used for the 2018 Report largely follows the IOC World List version 8.2 (Gill & Donsker 2018), replacing the previously referenced BOU British List (British Ornithologists' Union 2013). The three numbers in parentheses after each species refer respectively to (a) the total number of birds up to 31st December 1949; (b) the total number of birds from 1st January 1950, up to, but excluding, the current year — where this total is enclosed in square brackets, totals are from 1st January 2010 only; (c) the total number of new individuals for the current year. Some totals are minimum figures due to lack of precise numbers in historical texts — where this is the case, the total is succeeded by a '+'. In addition to the species totals, the total number of individuals being added to the species total is included immediately following the county name. Please note that the finders' credits are placed in alphabetical order, with a limit of two names per record.

Black Brant Branta bernicla nigricans (0: 39: 0)

Kerry Zero: Adult, Castlegregory 11th January to 5th February, also at Ventry on 25th March, photographed (M.O'Clery *et al.*), presumed returning individual last recorded in February 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 58).

Canada Goose Branta canadensis (0; 43; 1)

Mayo One: One, possibly of the race *interior*, Termoncarragh and Cross Lough from October 2017 remained until 9th April, photographed (M.Reilly, D.Suddaby *et al.*), presumed same individual last recorded in April 2017 (see below); One, possibly of the race *interior*, Inishkea North, 28th October (D.Suddaby).

2017 Donegal One: One, of the race *interior*, Dunfanaghy New Lake, 25th February (M.Boyle, A.McMillan).

2017 Mayo Zero: One, possibly of the race *interior*, Belderra, Termoncarragh and Cross Lough from 23rd October to 9th April 2018, photographed (D.Suddaby *et al.*), presumed returning individual (see below 2016 Mayo).

2016 Mayo One: One, possibly of the race *interior*, Belderra, Termoncarragh and Cross Lough from 13th December to 28th March 2017, photographed (D.Suddaby *et al.*).

Cackling Goose Branta hutchinsii (0; 32; 0) 2017 Donegal One: One, race undertermined, Kilcar, 16th January (T.Campbell, C.Ingram et al.).

Tundra Bean Goose Anser serrirostris

(0; 33; 4)

Galway Four: Three, Belclare Turlough, 27th January (E.Delaney), with four there, 28th January, photographed (D.Storey-Branagh). The first record for the county.

Taiga/Tundra Bean Goose

Anser fabalis/rossicus (0; 5; 0)

2017 Donegal Three: Three, unaged, Ardee, Lough Swilly, 26th November (P.McCarron, R.Sheppard).

The views obtained precluded specific identification.

Russian White-fronted Goose

Anser albifrons albifrons (51; 120; 2)

Wexford Two: Adult, Wexford Wildfowl Reserve, 1st to 20th January, photographed (K.Grace, A.Walsh *et al.*); First-winter, Wexford Wildfowl Reserve, 6th January (P.Kelly).

Blue-winged Teal Anas discors (3; 110; 2)

Galway One: First calendar-year male, Loch Phort Chorrúch, Inishmore, 29th September (N.T.Keogh).

Kerry One: Juvenile female, Trabeg, Dingle Peninsula, 2nd to 10th October (M.O'Clery *et al.*).

The Galway record is the ninth for the county, with the most recent at Rahasane Turlough on 19th October 2013 (*Irish Birds* 10: 75). The Kerry record is the eighth for the county, with the most recent involving a male at Ballylongford on 27th to 30th March 2013 (*Irish Birds* 10: 75).

American Wigeon Anas americana (0; 146; 6)

Donegal Two: Adult male, Culdaff Estuary, 7th January and 3rd February, photographed (C.Ingram, R.Sheppard), presumed same individual reported from November 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 58); First-year male, Culdaff Estuary, 18th November, and (unaged) male and female there on 25th November, photographed (T.Campbell, D.Charles *et al.*), male presumed returning.

Galway One: Adult male, Loch Phort Chorrúch, Inishmore, 22nd October, photographed (S.McCann, J.Proudfoot).

Wexford One: Adult male, Tacumshin Lake, 20th and 21st May, photographed (K.Mullarney *et al.*).

Wicklow Two: Second calendar year male, Broad Lough, 24th May, photographed (J.Proudfoot); Adult male, Kilcoole, 14th October, photographed (M.Boyle).

The Wexford male was apparently paired with a female Eurasian Wigeon *Anas penelope*.

Lesser Scaup Aythya affinis (0; 42; 0)

Sligo Zero: Adult male, Lough Gara, 28th October (S.Feeney), presumed returning individual last reported in January 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 58).

King Eider Somateria spectabilis (4; 29; 3)

Clare One: First-winter male, Flaggy Shore, 13th to 19th March, photographed (P.Troake et al.).

Cork One: First-winter female, Toormore, Dunmanus Bay, 10th March to 17th April, photographed (K.Cronin *et al.*).

Donegal Zero: Eclipse adult male, off Inishfad Beach, Donegal Bay, 22nd August, photographed (D.Hutchinson Edgar, N.Hutchinson Edgar), presumed returning bird, last reported in October 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 59).

Kerry Zero: Female, Sandy Bay, Castlegregory, 11th to 25th January (M.O'Clery *et al.*), presumed same individual reported in December 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 59).

Mayo One: First-winter male, Blacksod Bay, 19th to 21st February (D.Suddaby).

Sligo Zero: Adult male, Tanrego, Ballysadare Bay, 14th January (T.Hunter, S.McCanny), presumed returning bird last reported in March 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 59).

Surf Scoter Melanitta perspicillata ((6; 251; 10)

Clare Zero: Adult male, Bishop's Quarter, 7th March, then Flaggy Shore from 14th March, Coolsiva Pier 30th March to 13th April, and Rine, 27th April (P.Cullinan, J.N.Murphy *et al.*). Presumed same individual off Rine, 15th October and Coolsiva Pier 25th December. Presumed returning

bird previously recorded in December 2017 (Irish Birds 11: 59).

Donegal Two: Female, Ballymoney, 13th January (D.Brennan); Female, Mountcharles, 24th to 29th December, photographed (G.Thomas *et al.*).

Dublin One: A pair and two adult males, Balbriggan from 19th to 25th March, then four males and a female off Hampton Cove on 5th April and a peak count of five males (one new bird) and a female off Barnageeragh, Skerries on 6th April, photographed (A.G.Kelly, P.Kelly *et al.*), presumed to involve returning birds from the series of records along the Meath and North Dublin coastline reported in 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 59).

Kerry Three: Male, Brandon Bay, 2nd February (E.Carty), presumed one of two males present in December 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 59); Adult female, Rossbeigh, 9th to 20th February, photographed (P.Lehikoinen *et al.*); First-winter male, Reen Pier, Ballinskelligs Bay, 3rd to 13th February, photographed (D.Jeffree *et al.*), presumed same individual last reported December 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 59); First calendar-year male, Rossbeigh, 20th March, photographed (M.O'Clery); Adult female, Inny Strand, 30th August (P.Troake).

Mayo One: First-winter male, Broadhaven Bay, 11th to 13th January (D.Suddaby et al.).

Meath Zero: Male, Laytown, 2nd January, and a male and female pair there from 7th January, also reported at Gormanstown, Ben Head and Bettystown, with three adult males off Ben Head on 20th April 2018 (A.G.Kelly, P.Kelly *et al.*), presumed to involve returning birds from the series of records along the Meath and North Dublin coastline reported in 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 59).

Wexford Three: First-winter male and first-winter female, Rosslare, 27th January to 7th April, photographed (P.Kelly *et al.*); Adult male, Curracloe, 17th February (K.Grace).

Black Scoter *Melanitta americana* (0; 1; 0)

Kerry Zero: Adult male, off Rossbeigh, recorded regularly until 7th April, and again from 24th October to 28th December, photographed (S.Enright, D.Farrar *et al.*), presumed returning individual last reported in October 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 59).

Bufflehead Bucephala albeola (0; 2, 1)

Cork One: Adult female, Ballinacarriga Lake, 26th November to 15th December, photographed (R.O'Driscoll *et al.*).

The third record for Ireland, and the second for Cork, following a female at The Gearagh, Cork, between 18th January and 8th March 1998 (Irish Birds 6: 386), and a first-year male at Lough Atedaun, Clare, between 6th January and 4th March 2007 (*Irish Birds* 8: 587).

Pacific Diver Gavia pacifica (0; 3; 1)

Cork One: Adult, Crookhaven, 18th January to 18th April, photographed (S.Cronin *et al.*), and, presumed same in breeding plumage from 7th October to 30th December (P.Connaughton *et al.*). **Galway** Zero: Adult, off Tawin, 7th February (P.Lehikoinen *et al.*), presumed returning.

The Galway bird is considered to be the same individual found off Tawin in April 2014 (*Irish Birds* 10: 239), which was the second Irish record. The Cork bird is the fourth Irish record, and first for the county.

White-billed Diver Gavia adamsii (0; 22; 1)

Donegal One: Adult, off Tory Island, 28th April to 2nd June, (D,Brennan *et al.*), presumed returning bird; Adult, breeding plumage, Bunagee Pier, Culdaff Bay, 1st to 7th August, photographed (P.Higgins).

The run of records in late spring from Tory Island continues for the fourth year, and may involve some returning birds. See also Appendix 5 for corrections to previous reports.

Wilson's Storm-petrel

Oceanites oceanicus (2; 491; 88)

Cork 78: One, south of Seven Heads, 24th May, photographed (P.Connaughton); Four, south of Baltimore, 5th June, photographed (P.Connaughton *et al.*); Four, south of Baltimore, 7th June (P.Connaughton *et al.*); One, south of Baltimore, 21st July (P.Connaughton *et al.*); 59, south of Cape Clear Island, 29th July, photographed (P.Connaughton *et al.*); One, south of Cape Clear Island, 4th August (P.Connaughton *et al.*); Two, south of Baltimore, 12th August (P.Connaughton *et al.*); Four, south of Baltimore, 18th August (P.Connaughton *et al.*); One, south of Baltimore, 19th August (P.Connaughton *et al.*); One, south of Baltimore, 2nd September (P.Connaughton *et al.*)

Clare Five: One, off Bridges of Ross, 14th June (J.N.Murphy); One, off Bridges of Ross, 6th August (G.Pearson), One, off Bridges of Ross, 15th August (P.Cullinan); One, off Bridges of Ross, 24th August, photographed (K.Langdon); One, off Bridges of Ross, 9th September (D.Dack *et al.*).

Kerry Five: Four, Skellig Michael, 8th August (J.N.Murphy); One, Skellig Michael, 7th September (J.N.Murphy).

As in the last two years, the regular late summer pelagic trips out of Baltimore, Cork provided the bulk of the records, although numbers were a bit lower in 2018. The degree of double-counting of some individuals and overlap between trips is unknown.

Black-browed Albatross

Thalassarche melanophris (0; 12; 1)

Kerry One: Adult, Skellig Michael, 1st May, photographed (J.N.Murphy).

The 13th record for Ireland, and the first since an adult off the Annagh Peninsula, Mayo on 22nd September 2009 (*Irish Birds* 9: 445). This is the second record for Kerry, following an adult in Brandon Bay on 15th August 1964 (IBR 12: 7).

Zino's/Fea's/Desertas Petrel

Pterodroma madeira/feae/deserta (0; 121; 9) Cork Nine: One, off Ballycotton, 26th July (B.Power); One, off Mizen Head, 28th July (D.O'Sullivan); One, from a pelagic trip offshore from Cape Clear, 26th August, photographed (P.Connaughton, S.Enright et al.); One, off Seven Heads, 10th September (P.Connaughton); Five (three singles and two together), off Galley Head, 17th September (C.Cronin).

A good year. Five past Galley Head in one day becomes the highest day total recorded to date, after three past Galley Head on 31st July 2013 (*Irish Birds* 10: 76). There have now been 29 birds recorded from Galley Head compared to 28 from the Bridges of Ross.

Barolo Shearwater Puffinus baroli (1; 24; 1)

Clare One: One, off Bridges of Ross, 23rd August (A.McMillan, N.Warnock $\it{et\ al.}$).

Glossy Ibis Plegadis falcinellus (103; 332; 23) Clare One: One, Liscannor, 8th January (J.N.Murphy).

Cork Ten: Four, Rathbarry, 1st to 3rd January, photographed (C.Barton, C.Cronin), first recorded in December 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 61); Six, Lissagriffin, 15th January (D.Lysaght, P.Wolstenholme); One, Garretstown, 25th March to 18th April, photographed (A.Renshaw *et al.*); One, Ballymacoda, 25th March (J.Kennedy); Two, in off the sea, Mizen Head, 26th September (D.Ballard).

Galway One: One, Eyrephort, 11th to 17th January, photographed (M.O'Malley *et al.*).

Laois One: One, flying over the M8 on the Laois border, 12th May (E.Dempsey).

Louth One: One, Rockmarshall and subsequently upriver from Dundalk Docks, 20th to 27th September, photographed (T.Cooney *et al.*).

Westmeath Two: One, Cloonbonny, 15th January (P.Maher), with two there 22nd January, photographed (T.Kelly).

Wexford Four: Two, Cahore, 5th January (C.Cardiff) and, presumed one of these two, Cahore, 25th to 31st March, photographed (E.MacLochlainn *et al.*) and, one, Cahore, 25th April (C.Cardiff); One, Lady's Island Lake, 12th to 14th October, photographed (P.Kelly *et al.*), also seen Tacumshin Lake, 25th October, photographed (P.Archer); One, The Pill, Rosslare, 2nd to 30th December, photographed (A.A.Kelly, P.Kelly *et al.*).

Wicklow Three: One, East Coast Nature Reserve, 21st January, and three from 23rd January to 30th March, with one bird again at East Coast Nature Reserve on 8th April, and two there from 27th April to 2nd May, photographed (N.Hatch, R.Moore *et al.*), also seen Newcastle Airfield.

The record from Laois is the first for the county. The record from Louth is the fourth for the county, following one at Grangebellew between 3rd May and 7th August 2014 (*Irish Birds* 10: 242), one at Ardee on 18th October 2014 (*Irish Birds* 10: 242) and one at Castletown River, Dundalk between 28th and 30th August, later moving to Lurgangreen between 30th August and 24th October (*Irish Birds* 10: 549). The degree of double-counting of some mobile individuals is unknown, although must be inevitable!

Spoonbill Platalea leucorodia (92: 177: 1)

Kerry Zero: Returning adult, Cromane Harbour, from 28th September 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 61) remained to 24th February (M.O'Clery *et al.*), and again from 17th September to 27th December, photographed (S.Enright *et al.*); Adult, Portmagee, 14th to 28th October, photographed (P.MacDaid *et al.*), presumed same individual reported in October 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 61).

Waterford Zero: Two, The Cunnigar, Dungarvan 1st January, with three there, 6th January to 2nd February and two from 11th February to 7th May (A.Malcolm, J.N.Murphy *et al.*); presumed some of the two adults and three juveniles, first seen in October 2016 (*Irish Birds* 10: 550 & 11: 61).

Wexford One: First-winter, Lady's Island Lake, 4th November to 1st December, photographed, also seen at Tacumshin Lake on 24th November and Rosslare Backstrand on 1st December (P.Kelly *et al.*).

Bittern Botuaris stellaris (161+; 47; 4)

Wexford One: One, in flight, Lingstown, Tacumshin Lake, 2nd November (P.Kelly).

Wicklow Three: One, Woodenbridge, 26th January, photographed (T.Walsh); One, Jack White's Cross, Ballynapark, 24th October, photographed (E.Dempsey, J.N.Murphy *et al.*); One, flying east 500m offshore from the south side of Wicklow Head, 30th October (N.Veale). The possibility of the two October records in Wicklow involving the same individual cannot be ruled out.

Squacco Heron Ardeola ralloides (11; 11; 1)

Wexford One: One, Greenore Point, 20th April (A.A.Kelly).

The third record for Wexford, following one at Ferrycarrig Heritage Park from 19th April to 6th May 1988 (*Irish Birds* 4: 84 & 5: 450), and an adult at South Slob on 29th May 2007 (*Irish Birds* 8: 588).

Cattle Egret Bubulcus ibis (0; 363; 104)

Carlow Two: Two, River Burren, Fenagh, 20th December (M.McCarthy).

Clare One: One, Quinn Road, Ennis, 4th December (J.N.Murphy). Cork 32: Three breeding plumage adults, near Cul-de-sac Pool, Clonakilty, 10th April (C.O'Sullivan); Two, Croagh Estuary, 9th October, photographed (C.Foley, D.Foley et al.); One, Lough Errul, Cape Clear Island, 10th October, photographed (V.Caschera et al.); One, south of Skibbereen Golf Course, 11th October (J.Wyllie); One, near Clonakilty, 13th October (D.Charles); One, Cape Clear Island, 21st to 25th October, photographed (M.Cadogan et al.); One, The Gearagh, 22nd October (M.O'Donovan), presumed same 3rd December, and two there from 9th to 29th December; One, near Cul-de-sac Pool, Clonakilty, 24th October (P.Lombard); Four, White's Marsh, 5th November (C.Cronin et al.), with three remaining until 18th November; One, Dursey Island, 2nd to 8th November (K.Finch, B.O'Leary et al.); Three, Slatty's Pool, 21st November, increased to four there, 30th November (T.Gittings et al.), with three still present 3rd December; Two, Fountainstown, 15th November (S.Bayley); Six, Oldcourt, 27th November (J.Mitchell, M.Mitchell et al.); Two, Lough Clubir, Unionhall, 29th November (P.Moore, D.O'Sullivan et al.), still present 5th

December; One, Enniskeane, 21st to 30th December (M.O'Donovan). **Dublin** Three: One, Cabinteely Park, 31st January, photographed (P.O'Riordan); One, Portmarnock, 25th November, photographed (J.Hayes); One, Turvey Golf Course, 12th December (B.Carruthers). Galway Four: One, Ballyconneely, 30th September to 14th October, photographed (D.Rees *et al.*); One, Roscam Point, 21st October, photographed (D.McNicholas *et al.*); Two, flying south, Gort, 10th December (J.N.Murphy).

Kerry One: One, Tubrid, Kenmare, 31st January to 24th February, photographed (C.Daly *et al.*).

Kildare Five: Four flying west, south of Naas, 24th June (L.Geraty, S.Geraty); One, Kileen Golf Club, 7th to 11th December, photographed (P.Kelly).

Limerick Five: Four, Bunlicky, 8th November, with five present from 19th November, and at Ballykeeffe near Dooradoyle, 24th November, with two birds remaining there on 29th November, photographed (S.Bylin, B.Clarfield-Bylin *et al.*).

Mayo One: One, Tallagh, Belmullet Peninsula, 16th to 19th November, photographed (A.Irwin, D.Suddaby *et al.*).

Sligo One: One, Enniscrone, 11th to 14th November (M.Casey *et al.*). **Waterford** 11: Up to three birds from 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 63) remained in Ballyshoneen area from 1st January to 25th February, photographed (P.Archer, C.Flynn *et al.*); One, Knockaderry, 11th February (M.Dennehy); One, Killongford, 7th November, photographed (J.A.Power); One, Seafield, Bunmahon, 9th & 10th November, photographed (D.Weldon); One, Ardmore, 6th December (M.Cowming sr); Six, Kilmacleague, Tramore, 22nd December (A.Smith); One, Kinsalebeg, 22nd December (A.O'Brien).

Wexford 38: Four, Killag, 9th February were presumed to remain from 2017 (Irish Birds 11: 63), with three still present, 27th February and one bird around Tacumshin Lake, Lingstown and Tomhaggard to 9th May (K.Grace, R.Hynes et al.); One, Lingstown, Tacumshin Lake, 6th to 28th October, photographed (C.Cardiff, J.Cusack et al.); One, Lady's Island Lake, 19th October, and two there that evening, photographed (B.Haslam, K.Mullarney et al.), increasing to 23 birds on 21st October, with 12 on 22nd October, three on 23rd October and one on 28th October; One, Drinagh, 30th October, presumed same there, 24th November (S.Farrell et al.); One, Cahore, 2nd to 17th November (C.Cardiff, T.Kavanagh); One, 2km north of Ferrycarrig, 2nd November (A.A.Kelly, P.Kelly); One, Tacumshin Lake, 11th to 30th November (P.Kelly); One, Lady's Island Lake, 13th November (R.Hynes, T.Kavanagh); One, Ballycanew, 3rd December (C.Cardiff); Six, Drinagh, 29th December into 2019 (K.Grace, G.O'Sullivan); Two, Wexford Wildfowl Reserve, 14th December (P.Kelly).

It is hard to know the degree of double-counting, with birds moving between sites, particularly in Cork and Wexford. See also Appendix 5 for corrections to previous reports.

Cork One: One, in flight over a farm at Knockgriffin, Midleton, 24th June (P.Moore).

Wexford One: One, Tacumshin Lake, 28th April (P.Kelly).

Great White Egret *Ardea alba* (0; 116; 14) **Clare** Three: One, Loch Atedaun, 20th April and 16th May (J.L.Copner);

Initial photographs of the bird raised the possibility of it being a Taiga Flycatcher with some birders however, it wasn't until late evening on 24th when CC looked at photographs he had taken that day, that he became more convinced. Opinions from further afield were in favour of Taiga Flycatcher, and luckily the bird was still present on 25th, when it finally showed well to many observers, allowing the key features to be seen in the field, and also for the call to be recorded. A steep learning curve for the finders!

Ruddy Shelduck *Tadorna ferruginea* - In the Irish Rare Bird Report 2017, the record of the first year female, Tacumshin Lake, 17th May to 6th June (*Irish Birding* 11: 82) should read as follows: Adult female, Tacumshin Lake, 17th May to 6th June, photographed (K.Mullarney *et al.*), also recorded at Cahore, 20th to 22nd May (C.Cardiff, T.Cardiff *et al.*).

White-billed Diver *Gavia adamsii* - Incorrect statistics were given in the Irish Rare Bird Report 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 60). The text (0; 19; 1) should be replaced with (0; 21; 1).

Black Stork *Ciconia nigra* - In the commentary for this species in the Irish Rare Bird Report 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 60) the location of the first Irish record was erroneously given as Phoenix Park: this should read Foxrock.

Cattle Egret *Bubulcus ibis* - In the Irish Rare Bird Report 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 62), the At Sea record should actually be in Cork as it is in inshore waters; the Cork account should therefore read Cork 17: (not 16 as published). In addition, the total for new sightings in Wexford should read Wexford 17: (not 16 as published). As a result, the overall statistics should be replaced with (0, 305, 58).

American Golden Plover *Pluvialis dominica* - In the Irish Rare Bird Report 2016, the record of two, Cashen Estuary, 7th October, photographed (*Irish Birds* 10: 553) should read as follows: "Two juveniles, Cashen Estuary, 7th October 2016, photographed (D.Farrar), with one still present on 14th October." In addition, incorrect statistics were given in the Irish Rare Bird Report 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 65). The text (1; 297; 18) should be replaced with (1; 307; 18).

Semipalmated Plover Charadrius semipalmatus — In the Irish Rare Bird Report 2016, the record of the Adult summer, Tacumshin Lake, 26th July (Irish Birding 10: 554) should read as follows: "Adult male, Tacumshin Lake, 26th July (P.Lonergan, K.Mullarney), photograph Birdwatch 291: 13." The subsequent explanatory text should read "With only two prior records (2003 and 2011), four records in 2016 is exceptional. The July sighting at Tacumshin Lake was the first adult, with the remaining records to date involving four juvenile birds in October, and the first-summer bird at Tacumshin Lake in May and June 2016."

Marsh Sandpiper *Tringa stagnatilis* - Incorrect statistics were given in the Irish Rare Bird Report 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 67). The text (0; 4; 1) should be replaced with (0; 5; 1).

Semipalmated Sandpiper Calidris pusilla - It is now considered that the Adult winter at Tacumshin Lake 18 to 28th November 2016 is the same bird as that found there 29th September 2016 (Irish Birds 10: 557). The text for sightings in Wexford in the Irish Rare Bird Report 2016 (Irish Birds 10: 557) should therefore read as follows: "Wexford Seven: Juvenile, Bannow Island, Bannow Bay, 12th September, photographed (T.Murray); Four juveniles, Tacumshin Lake, 17th September to 25th October, photographed (K.Grace,

K.Mullarney, M.Stewart *et al.*), comprising, two juveniles, 17th September (K.Grace, M.Stewart), a new juvenile, 20th September (K.Mullarney), and, another new juvenile, 22nd September (K.Mullarney), at least two of these remained until 14th October, and, the bird found 20th September was still present on 25th October; Adult, Tacumshin Lake, 29th September to 28th November, photographed (S.King, K.Mullarney *et al.*), photograph *Birdwatch* 295: 16; Juvenile, Rosslare Back Strand, 1st October, photographed (P.Kelly)." In addition, the statistics given in the Irish Rare Bird Report 2016 (*Irish Birds* 10: 556) need to be amended, and the text (0; 195; 27), should be replaced with (0; 195; 26). Correspondingly, incorrect statistics were also presented in the Irish Rare Bird Report 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 69). The text (0; 222; 11), should be replaced with (0; 221; 11).

Dusky Warbler *Phylloscopus fuscatus* — In the commentary for this species in the Irish Rare Bird Report 2016 (*Irish Birds* 10: 569) it is stated that "Eight of the 12 records have occurred in Cork"; in fact the Cork total is nine.

Barred Warbler *Sylvia nisoria* - Incorrect statistics were given in the Irish Rare Bird Report 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 76). The text (6; 209; 5) should be replaced with (6; 207; 5).

Water Pipit *Anthus spinoletta* - In the Irish Rare Bird Report 2017 (*Irish Birds* 11: 79), the total for new sightings in Wicklow should read Wicklow Three: (not Four as published). As a result, the overall statistics should be replaced with (1; 167; 13).

Philadelphia Vireo *Vireo philadelphicus* — Following submission of additional information, the first date has been revised to 6th October 1985 (A.Duggan), however the bird was only identified on 12th October (J.F.Dowdall *et al.*).
